

Waimea Trails and Greenways

MEETING NOTES

June 8, 2009

PRESENT: Clem Lam, Avi Okin, Peggi Kamisato, Leningrad Elairionoff

1. Last Friday tree #194 near Carter Center behind Keoki Magoon's property broke and fell across the stream and trail. It was about 12" in diameter and snapped about 30 feet up the tree. Leningrad, Avi and Clem cleared the tree on Saturday.
2. Bob Hunter said that Waimea Trails and Greenways was listed on the latest STIP revision!
3. Pete Hoffmann called Clem last Tuesday to follow up on the meeting with Bob Fitzgerald and James Komata. He said he thought it would be a good idea to spend some of the \$2 mill from the County bond float so that we get something on the ground. Clem told him our priority would be to put in the stream crossings. In the Monday meeting James did not think that was possible but subsequent talks he had with David Imata, that could be a possibility. We will pursue that.
4. Debbie Chang and James met with Morgan Davis of SHPD last Friday who said she will try to expedite the archeological study - James to follow up with Gerald Park.
5. Last week we walked the trail from Opelo Road to Kahawai Street with James to look at the trail alignment and putting in the fence. James sees problems with terrain and County process in putting in the fence along the trail alignment which would leave a large swath of unused easement between the fence and the stream. Leningrad suggested that we invite Brandie from Parker Ranch to our next meeting to discuss having Parker Ranch put a fence in on their side to contain their cattle and horses and we pay for it from the County fund. Clem will call Brandie to see if he can make it to our next meeting.
The fence between Sandal wood and Parker Ranch is done in this way. It would simplify the fencing at the Kahawai end of the trail. We could avoid cumbersome County procurement processes.
