

# Waimea Trails and Greenways

## MEETING NOTES

March 8, 2010

PRESENT: Clem Lam, Avi Okin, Leningrad Elarionoff, Peggi Kamisato, Margaret Willie

1. Parker Ranch easement across from Sandalwood - according to the map, the easement is tight to the stream - when this gets surveyed on the ground it may prove to be in terrain that is not very accessible. This should be explored.
2. Margaret Willie tried to get a defined easement through Parker School that would include access across to the south side of the stream. Also she wanted to make sure that the trail easement would be far enough from the stream that it was not on terrain that made it impossible or overtly costly to make the trail. The proposals were not adopted by the Planning Commission.
3. Margaret was also interested in where the trail went on either side of Parker School - to the west it is through the Lodge property that is owned by Richard Smart Article 20 Trust and managed by Bank of Hawaii Trust. They have not been receptive to working with us to offer an easement. To the east is a piece of State land that we have an easement through.
4. Margaret brought up as lot up for sale in the Parker Ranch subdivision above Imiola church that has a puu on it. she thought it would make a great destination for a network of trails.
5. Easements east of Lindsey Road should be part of the work that the County is actively pursuing as part of the Trail project.
