- 1. Kahawai Street what is the disposition of this? Glen Kimura was looking into the ownership? Is it Parker Ranch's to offer an easement? Is Dennis Norman correct in his assertion that he is part owner? Who is following up? Where are the answers?
- 2. Parker Ranch fence and easement from Kahawai Street to Lalamilo Research Station what is the status here? Is Parker Ranch going to put in a fence on the south side of the Waikoloa Stream? Is the County going to indemnify Parker Ranch? Is this a temporary solution or a permanent solution?
- 3. Lalamilo Research Station Fence- The County needs to move forward NOW on the fence so we can have our work day needs to locate where the fence will go and put up the materials we have the grant that expires in 7 months (5 months have elapsed in the life of this grant!)
- 4. Motor bike rider on the trail the rider is still riding his bike on the trail, upsetting the neighbors. A note has been left on his bike at one point and he simply threw it away. What recourse do we have?
- 5. World War II stream ford and bridge behind Catholic Church need for preservation plan who is in charge of seeing this bit of work gets done? Command? Komata? Maybe we can get the Army from Pohakuloa to help remove it.
- 6. Easements to the east of Lindsey Road this is a topic that keeps being ignored this should be worked on now and has no reliance on the NEPA process or Increment 1 design. Bobby someone needs to be working on this actively working with Parker School, the Lodge, Baptist Church, etc.
- 7. Ask Bobby Command for an overall update on trail issues NEPA process, and all the above issues status report can you do this at our next Monday meeting?
- 8. Developing a marketing strategy we need to get positive word out to people and to make a case for getting this trail and others in place to promote a healthier populace, more beautiful community and

transportation alternatives:

- Mini workdays invite small groups to work on specific sections for short periods of time - ie: spread wood chips from Nature Park to Opelo Road.
- Mini walks invite groups to walk the open part of trail Church, seniors, Keck, schools
- Go to Community meetings Community Association, South Kohala Traffic Safety Committee, Rotary
